## Dubba Chetty shop sells Deepavali marundhu in two forms

Deepavali is here. You must have bought or made sweets and savories. But do you have a bit of Deepavali marundhu that will take care of you as you and your family enjoy all the goodies?

One place that many Mylaporeans have gone to over the ages, for this marundhu has been the 138-year-old Dabba Chetty shop, now located on North Mada Street.

"We have been making Deepavali marundhu for more than 30 years.

It should have probably started with one kilogram. Now, we make it as and when the stock gets over because people like it to be fresh and flavourful," says K. Badrinath, the owner, whose great grandfather started the business.

Badrinath's son Krishna is also into this business today.

Badrinath says people prefer to buy either powder or the legiyam. "Not many people buy raw materials to make the Deepavali marundhu these days so the legiyam sells fast," he adds.

Badrinath says sukku, chitarattai,

kanda tippuli and omam are the main ingredients used to make the Deepavali marundhu. Pepper, Jeera, Elakkai, Lavanga Pattai are also added.

"There is a certain proportion to be followed to make the marunthu. It takes about 3 to 4 hours to make it," he adds.

Customers who buy the powder can make the marunthu in about 15 to 30 minutes, he says.

A 80gms packet of Deepavali marundhu in legiyam form costs Rs 100 and in powder form, it costs Rs 100 for 60 grams.

The Dabba Chetty Shop moved from Kutchery Road to its present location in North Mada street in December 2022, due to Chennai Metro rail work.

Known for its native medicines, the shop sells a range of products including post-natal legiyam and face packs. Special puja items and items needed for homam and marriage are also sold here.

"Our shop used to store products in dabbas (boxes). We still have some of them. People started calling us Dabba Chetty kadai and it became the name of our shop," says Krishna.

Balu sent us a 'thank you' after 'Mylapore Times' did a feature on Deepak. This special young man is part of Balu's family.

Deepak, assisted by his mother, paints simple diyas and pots and turns them into little items you can gift or buy at Deepavali time. The creative effort and the sales does a lot to the spirits of the family.

## **MY STORY**



## Studying at P. S. High School in the 1960s By A. V. VISWANATHAN

Our family has connections with P. S. High School in many different ways. My mother and my maternal uncles studied there in the 1940s and 50s. My cousins and I studied in the 1960s and 70s.

Our family lived not far from this campus so when it was time to get admitted to a school, there was P. S. next door. But that era was so different from what it is today.

It was a 'boys only' when I was admitted here with classes from 6th standard to 10th standard

The students and teachers came from the neighbourhood areas. The school served students predominantly from lower middle class to poor families. I recall that the parents of these students worked in various professions such as

potters, daily labourers, school teachers, local grocers and small traders, auto-rickshaw drivers, masons, carpenters, milkmen and temple priests. There were also students whose parents worked for the state and central government while some worked for private companies.

Even though there were predominantly Hindu students in the school, we had several Christian and Muslim students from the area of the same demographics. The teachers encouraged us to celebrate all festivals of all religions together at the school including Deepavali, Christmas and Ramzan

We had very passionate teachers - who were simple, conservative, dedicated and sincere. While some of them were strict, many of them were friendly. There was good bonding between teachers and students that continues even today.

The school and the teachers believed in holistic education and in addition to academics, there was emphasis on sports, arts and social work. Physical education was given importance

Those were days when students and teachers

played cricket together - after school hours. The student teams and teachers' cricket teams used to compete in inter-school competition and we even won awards. The teachers and the school administration would help students with their tuition fees by securing merit-cum-means scholarships from Govt. and from private agencies.

The school produced many bright students who got state ranks in the public exams. I was school first in the 10th standard public exam and was in the top 20 ranks in the state.

As the students came from similar financial and social background, they were able to relate to each other and the bonds that were formed during school last even today.

Our school timings - 8:30 - 2:30 pm - allowed us plenty of time to play (both in school and outside) and that is how bonding took place.

I gained a lot of life skills that have served me very well in my professional and personal life. Tolerance, patience, empathy, friendship, discipline, hard work, being non-judgemental and contentment.

## **MUSICAL AT UTSAV**

It was called a Carnatic fantasy play. It was titled "Gandharvalokathil Oru Isai Maanaadu". And it was part of the opening evening's programme of the annual Bharat Sangeet Utsav 2023 held at Narada Gana Sabha, Alwarpet.

But the man who conceptualised it, artiste, teacher and festival curator, K. N. Shashikiran does not want to call it a play. Perhaps, a sort of musical but even that does not completely describe this production that had many people in the audience that

November 4 evening engaged.

Premiering it at the Utsav, it featured the drama legend Kathadi Ramamurthy and many popular Carnatic music artistes including Ashwath Narayanan, Thiruvarur Girish, Akshay Padmanabhan, K. Gayathri, Vidya Kalyanaraman, Anahita and Apoorva, R.P. Shravan and J.B. Keerthana besides others.

Shashikiran says the core of this production came from the content of a book on Carnatic music appreciation which led to a manuscript on a fantasy fiction which featured the old masters coming face to face with music and artistes of the day, and the

current generation of artistes imagining the times and music of old.

Veteran actor Kathadi Ramamurthy donned the role of the well-known music critic Subbudu and music artiste Sarvesh Karthik played the role of Naradhar. And the thread of the production was fleshed out around the duo and focussed on themes on the tradition, depth, practice and width of Carnatic music.



"I brought in elements of a music Anthakshari and a quiz," explains Shashikiran. "I set a scene in an amusement park and brought in some katha-kutcheri element too." This enabled him to feature various artistes to play distinct roles and present songs that suited the situation.

Since the artistes featured in this production are fairly busy with public concerts and travel a lot, they were briefed on their roles, given copies of the script and briefed about their scenes and how they would fit into the event.

There were small group rehearsals to start with and a few rehearsals in full on the eve of the show. 30 artistes featured in this production.

Shashikiran says the script and theme allows for flexibility - new themes on Carnatic music and featuring other artistes who wish to be part of this production, can be incorporated and some parts can be left out.

"I see the scope for staging this production a few more times if people are keen to have it," says the Dwaraka Colony resident, who has also curated the Utsav.

She said that Padma located Rajeswari Padmanabhan's compositions and chose five to notate and sing and record them and add it to her thesis record.

"Padma was a passionate, dedicated music scholar and artiste," said Shanti.

Said Dr. M. A. Bhageerathi, former HoD of music at QMC, "Padma was into music because of Padmavathi Ananthagopalan's disciple.

She performed regularly for All India Radio. I was her doctoral committee member and took classes for her when she did M.Phil. at QMC."

Padma was a 'B High' grade artiste of All India Radio and primarily sang for dance concerts.

#### Mandaveli's Raja St. community discuss local issues: Chennai Metro work, drains desilting

The local effects of the ongoing Chennai Metro work dominated the discussion at the Mandaveli Raja Street RWA conducted its 8th Annual General Body Meeting on Sunday, November 5 2023 in Raja Street.

Raja Street is currently at the epicentre of the CMRL work that is going on for laying the ground settlement markers that will be monitored during the underground tunneling work .



As per the current underground rail route, the underground track cuts under the dense residential zones of Raja Street.

CMRL has been laying new bore connections and plugging the bore connections which are within the 3m range of the underground tunnel.

At the meeting, the RWA team also briefed its members about the welfare activities executed in the last year. It was agreed that updates about the CMRL work will be provided to the residents regularly. The audited accounts were presented by the treasurer.

K. Mohan, a senior advisor for the RWA suggested new ideas to bring the residents together and to address core issues.

The office bearers for the RWA were re-elected – Kanthi Neelamegham – president, V. Santhosh – secretary, Shiva Kumar – vice president, Uma Krishnan -treasurer.

The core committee members are Ganga Sridhar, Rupa Rajesh, Shantha Shiva Kumar and Saranya Karthik – they will be actively supported by a team of young volunteers.

The committee members have escalated the problems related to storm water drains desilting work, – this was immediately attended to by the local GCC team.

This annual civic exercise, personally monitored by the residents, has helped Raja Street stay dry even during heavy rains.



## Residents annoyed with contractor who flouts rules at GCC site in Alwarpet

Residents on and off Dr. Ranga Road are unhappy with the building violations made by the civil contractor who is constructing the new community-wedding hall for Chennai Corporation on C. P. Ramaswamy Road on GCC's property.

They say that the contractor has flouted building rules and continues to do so without securing the construction site on all sides with ACP sheets, as is required mandatorily.

On both sides of this site, Chennai Corporation buildings exist — on one side is the campus that houses offices of the MLA and a councillor besides GCC offices and a shopping complex. On the other, is a recently-built hospital.

At the rear (east side of plot) are residential houses and people residing here say that for the past six months, they have been suffering from noise and dust pollution as ACP sheets have not been put up on this side of the site.

Said one resident who wished to remain anonymous, "Inspite of lodging an official complaint in August on the GCC website no action has been taken till date. Also contacting the local officials has been of no use."

They now want Mylapore MLA, Dha Velu whose office is next door, to get the contractor to respect the rules and save residents the problems they have faced.

Said another resident, "It is ironic that the GCC is quick to penalise private buildings who do not cover their construction site and turn a blind eye to public building construction sites."

"It was unending work all these years, sometimes thankless too. But I enjoyed every moment of it and am quite happy with whatever I have done at Kalakshetra," said Revathi days after she said goodbye to Kalakshetra and handed over charge to an officer there.

What next?

"I have not made up my mind yet," she said.

Revathi runs a Bharatanatyam school in Abiramapuram; her daughter Manaswini, also a dancer, handled its classes when Revathi was heading Kalakshetra.

### Statues of two celebrated Jesuit missionaries unveiled at Dhyana Ashram

The statues of two of the most celebrated Jesuit missionaries who came to the Tamil country in the 17th and 18th centuries, Robert de Nobili and Constantine Joseph Beschi were unveiled at Dhyana Ashram on Mada Church Road, R. A. Puram on November 8.

Fr. Jebamalai Irudhayaraj, provincial of the Jesuit Chennai Province, formally unveiled the two statues that were installed with the support of Xavier Britto, a businessman and well-wisher.

The two statues flank a vintage granite image of Mother Mary, which is believed to have been unearthed in this campus which was, for a few centuries, the hub of the Jesuits in the San Thome area.

After the formal function, there were presentations made on de Nobili and Beschi by scholar Fr. Anand Amaldass who is based at the Ashram, Prof. S. Amalraj, Loyola College and Fr. Maria Arul Raja.

Fr Darwin S. Michael, superior of the community at Dhyana Ashram and his team here hosted the event and arranged the hospitality.

Members of the local parishes, nuns and priests and local ward councillor participated.

The Ashram hosts workshops, seminars, talks and training for the Jesuits as well as for others here. The Mother of God church (Madre de Deus) is located here – its roots go back to the late 16th century when the Portuguese first built this church which was demolished some decades ago.



Robert de Nobili

J. Beschi

Robert de Nobili, a Jesuit missionary, spent much time in the Madurai area since 1606 when he arrived here. He appreciated and imbibed local culture and literature. mastered Sanskrit, Thamizh and Telugu, integrated Saiva texts and philosophy into his writings, localised theology in his communication and contributed much to Thamizh prose. He dressed like a sanyasi and adopted Indian customs. His final days were spent in the Madras region and it is believed that he was buried in San Thome.


Constantine J. Beschi, a Jesuit missionary, was in south Thamizh land since 1710, and later travelled in Pondicherry and Thaniavur. He too acknowledged Christian ideals in local culture / literature, mastered Saiva literature and incorporated local philosophy into his own writings and discourses. He was a Thamizh litterateur - compiling three dictionaries and writing books on grammar; he translated the Thirukkural into Latin and works like Thiruppugazh into European languages. His biggest poetical work is the Thembavani. He was called Veeramamunivar.
